This apprenticeship is aimed at employees working in a care role such as care workers, day care assistants, healthcare assistants, health care support workers or home care assistants.

Average Duration: The apprenticeship runs for 12 to 14 months



Course Information

The Intermediate Health and Social Care Apprenticeship is made up of a framework which includes:

- Health and Social Care Diploma NVQ Level 2
- Preparing to work in the Adult Social Care Certificate Level 2
- Maths Functional Skills Level 1
- English Functional Skills Level 1
- Employment Rights and Responsibilities

Progression

Apprentices may progress to advanced apprenticeship in Adult care.

Entry qualifications

Applicants will be assessed and interviewed to demonstrate that they are able to cover the range required by the relevant NVQ at work. In addition, the apprentices are expected to carry out initial assessments in English and Maths where they would be expected to ideally achieve a level 1 in both the subject areas. If you do have GCSE then they don't have to do functional skills as a part of the apprenticeship.

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Assessment

The apprentice is expected to attend college to attain knowledge, training and complete an online portfolio. In addition, they will also be trained by the employer which is then assessed by college assessors and put together as an online portfolio.

You can apply through the college application. Once you have applied to the college, you will be invited for an interview at the college and also with the potential employer.
